### How to apply:

Please submit the following items by email to the conference organisers at [rcm@iua.ie](mailto:rcm@iua.ie):

- A copy of your CV (3 pages maximum in PDF format), including your contact details.
- A URL link to a short video (3 min maximum) uploaded to Dropbox<sup>2</sup> ([www.dropbox.com](http://www.dropbox.com)) which features the following information:
  - Brief background of your research career to date and your plans for the future.
  - The obstacles you have encountered in achieving your goals and how (if) they were resolved. These obstacles should be relevant to the conference goals and concepts. <http://www.iua.ie/research-innovation/rcm/concept-goals/>
  - How you plan to contribute to the conference discussion.

Travel Bursary recipients will be acknowledged during the opening ceremony by the Commissioner Marie Geoghegan Quinn and will participate in a group photograph with the Commissioner and all 12 bursary winners. They will be expected to actively and enthusiastically contribute to the debate at the conference, including making a short presentation if requested to do so by the organisers.

### Closing Date:

The closing date for submitting an application is **Friday 5<sup>th</sup> April at 17:00 GMT.**

All applicants will be contacted by email with the results of the competition no later than Friday 12<sup>th</sup> April.

<sup>1</sup> A travel bursary will consist of funding for travel to Dublin (flights, train, bus etc.) and accommodation in Dublin up to a maximum of three nights. The conference organisers at the Irish Universities Association will book flights and accommodation on behalf of the bursary recipients. During the conference, lunch and dinner will be provided at the conference venue, and breakfast will be provided at the recipients' accommodation. Additional travel costs and meals consumed during travel will be refunded by the organisers on production of valid receipts/tickets: a claim form will be provided for this purpose.
